

X-to-C Cup

The great sailing records of the world – Ambrose Light to Lizard Point, the Route du Rhum, Round the Isle of Wight, Jules Verne Around the World, and Lake Norman X-to-C. The holders of these marks bear the distinction of being the fastest sailors on the planet.

On the inland waters of Lake Norman, the X-to-C tests the skills of skippers and crews of all types of wind-driven craft. The holder of the outright X-to-C Cup is the boat with the fastest elapsed time for the 12-mile course.

X-to-C records are also documented in any handicap and one-design class, giving all sailors a chance to prove they are the fastest in their craft.
